

Protecting the health, safety and security of our colleagues, the integrity of our assets, the natural environment, and the quality of our service to customers are all integral to the efficient management of our business.

Together we put SAFETY FIRST

We are committed to preventing all forms of harm as an unintended outcome of our operations and we recognise that process safety management – taking measures to control the potential in our business for major accidents such as fires, explosions, and accidental chemical releases– is essential to maintaining the integrity of our assets.

We believe that the safety and integrity of our assets is critical to the sustainability of our business and that all injuries, illnesses and incidents arising from failures of our assets are preventable. We put SAFETY FIRST in everything we do.

Good process safety management means making sure our facilities are well-designed, safely operated, properly inspected and maintained, enabling us to prevent any major incidents which might place our colleagues, contractors, neighbours, customers, the natural environment or our business at risk.

Our Process Safety policy commits us to:

- Understanding our process safety risks and managing them effectively
- Managing change in our operations and recognising its impact on process safety
- Assessing and maintaining the integrity of all our assets, plant, and equipment
- Training all colleagues in process safety and promoting a culture in which everyone understands the part they play in helping to contain and manage process safety risks
- Maintaining appropriate operating standards and managing hazards and risks to prevent or mitigate any undesired events
- Learning from events to take action to prevent them from happening again

To meet these commitments, we will:

- Develop and implement a systematic approach to process safety and asset integrity management and assurance
- Make the appropriate levels of financial and resource investment to maintain high levels of asset, plant and equipment integrity
- Ensure all directors, managers and colleagues are aware of and deliver against their process safety roles and responsibilities

- Ensure compliance with all relevant current and future legislation and where required, meet the requirements of the appropriate Codes of Practice
- Regularly measure, appraise, and report on the effectiveness of our process safety control measures and our performance
- Periodically review the suitability and effectiveness of this policy, our management systems and our targets and objectives
- Deploy process safety performance indicators to monitor process safety systems and asset integrity continuously – helping us to actively identify any system deficiencies and to provide an early warning when things may not be working as expected.

Accountabilities

The ultimate responsibility for process safety and asset integrity within Flogas Britain lies with the Managing Director.

The Senior Leadership and Senior Management Teams have overall responsibility for the application of this policy and for ensuring that the risks and impacts arising from our activities are understood and mitigated, so far as is reasonably practicable.

Everyone in Flogas Britain must understand the part they play themselves in helping to contain and manage process safety risks, recognising that this is part of our everyday work, taking personal responsibility to be aware of potential process safety or asset integrity risks, and helping to reduce these, within their working environment.

This policy statement applies to all our operating subsidiaries, all colleagues, contractors who choose to work with us, and anyone else who may influence our management of process safety or asset integrity.
